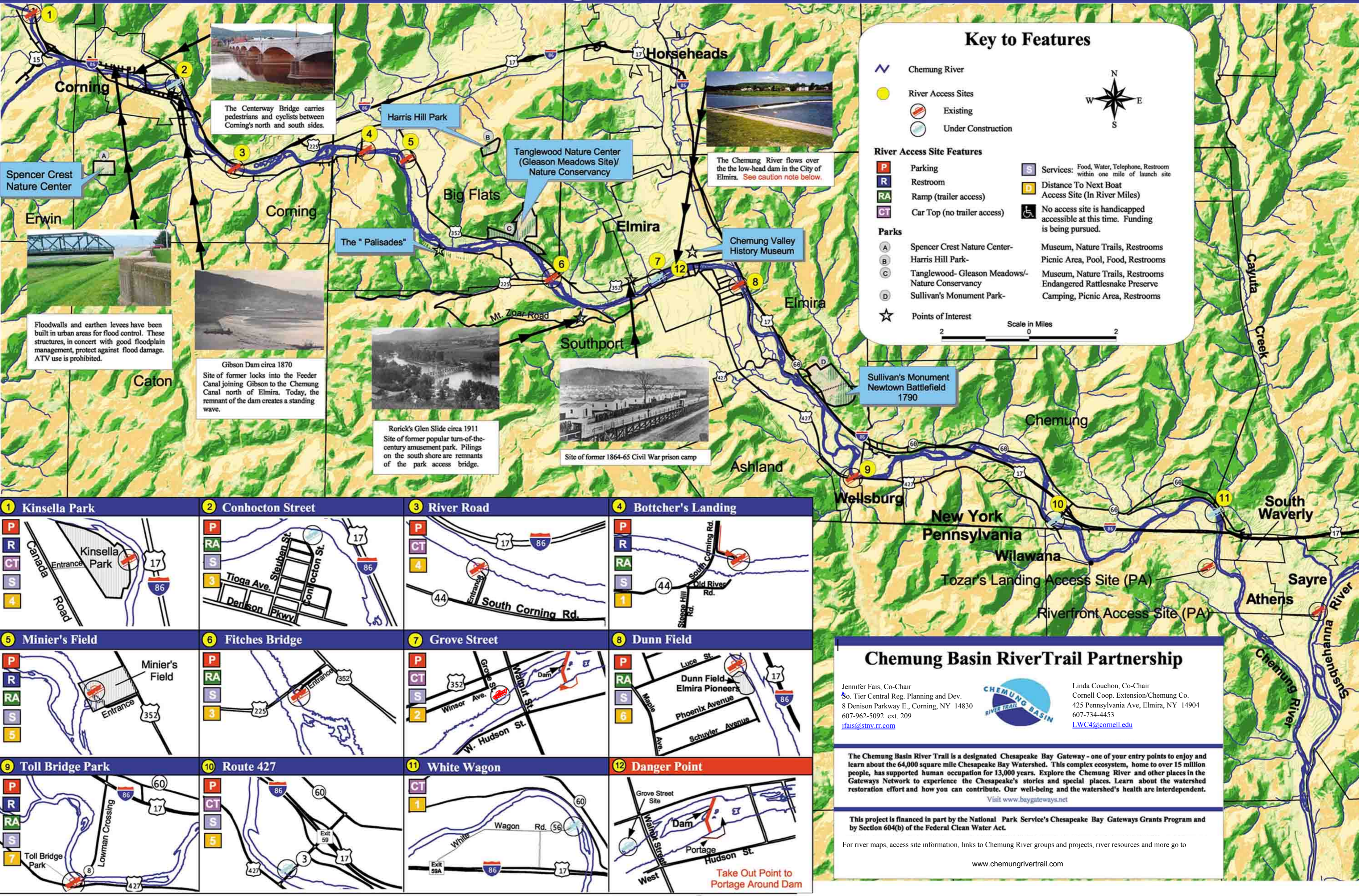


Chemung Basin River Trail Guide

- ♿** No access site is handicapped accessible at this time. Funding is being pursued.
