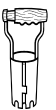
Cookie Sale for All

Every year, the 4-H sponsors committee runs two fundraisers: the cookie sale in the fall and the sub sale for the Animal Science projects in the spring. Each club and individual member is expected to participate in one of these two fundraisers. Another alternative is to become a sponsor by making a donation to 4-H for a specific project.

Why should each of us participate? One reason is the dollars and cents. With our county and state budget being cut, we need to maintain our programs. Our participation numbers are as high as ever, but we are concerned about funding everything. If each 4-H member would sell 2 boxes of cookies in the fall (\$7 worth), our financial situation would be more secure. Some of these funds are used to benefit members directly. Each year, scholarships are available for students going on to college. There are a number of trips that are funded with these monies. At fair, the trophies are supported. These are just a sampling.

4-H programming provides so many opportunities for students. We want to support the various interests and projects to the best of our ability. Please help us reach that goal. You can do it by participating in the cookie sale or sub sale, by making a donation, or both.

Remember: There is no I in TEAM. All of us working together can make sure 4-H is the best program possible.

Display Contest - Get your group together to discuss where you want to promote your 4-H spirit and accomplishments! 4-H Clubs and special interest groups can arrange for a store front window display, enclosed glass unit, or large table display at any place of business, organization, office or school. The purpose of the contest is to let the public know all the wonderful things that your club/group does.

Please note: When a display is inside a building it is very important to note the hours they are open for viewing and judging. Judges must travel the entire county within one day. Arrangements and schedules are very important to complete this successfully.

1. The 4-H Display contest form is available for you to pick up at the Administration Building 4-H office to register.
2. Entries must be in the Lockport office by **Tuesday, October 2nd.**

3. All displays must be ready for judging by **9:00am on Thursday, October 4th.**
4. Prizes for the Window Display and Showcase Display are rosettes for first, second, and third place. All displays will receive a green rosette after the judging is completed.
5. A ribbon and \$20.00 will be awarded to the Best Overall Display. To receive maximum points, the display should contain the following elements:
 - Name of the club or group, and where your club/group is located.
 - What your club/group likes to do, or what 4-H members can do.
 - How someone can join your club/group or get involved in 4-H. You can use the Lockport Office phone number, 433-8839.
 - The display should be neat, with good use of color and space, be balanced and have great eye appeal. Avoid clutter and items determined to flop over!
 - Use a title or theme.

NYS AGRI - BUSINESS CAREER CONFERENCE

The New York State 4-H Agribusiness Career Conference will be held on October 4 and 5, 2007 at SUNY Cobleskill and local agri-businesses. The conference is co-sponsored by NYS 4-H, the NYS Farm Bureau, and the State University at Cobleskill. This career exploration conference is open to all youth ages 14 and over who wish to become more aware of opportunities with agriculture and also academic requirements for professional positions available in the various agri-business. It will feature mini-tours to farms and operations in the Cobleskill area as well as seminars, guest speakers and guided tours of the SUNY Cobleskill agriculture facilities.

Participants and chaperones will be staying at the Best Western Inn in Cobleskill, located at the eastern end of town on the north side of Route 7 (behind Burger King).

A participating fee of \$75.00 per person (youth and adult) will include all overnight accommodations and meals. (If a participant wishes to come for just one day, that is acceptable, but the cost of the program is the same.)

Note: *The full registration fee of \$75.00 is due Friday, September 14th. There will be absolutely no refunds after September 21st due to motel expenses. A \$50.00 late fee will be charged per county for registrations received between September 14 and September 21.*

Some young people involved with the tractor games at the county fair have pushed to have such a course here in Niagara County not only for the safety education but to provide a pool of possible participants in the tractor operator's contest at Empire Farm Days and the games at the Niagara County Fair. Sometimes parents and grandparents want their youngsters to have this safety education as a matter of principle even if certification is not required.

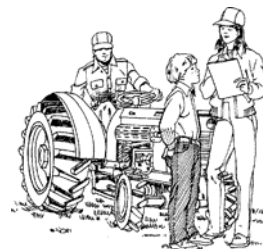

4. District winners application and attachments will be judged for the awarding of the scholarships.

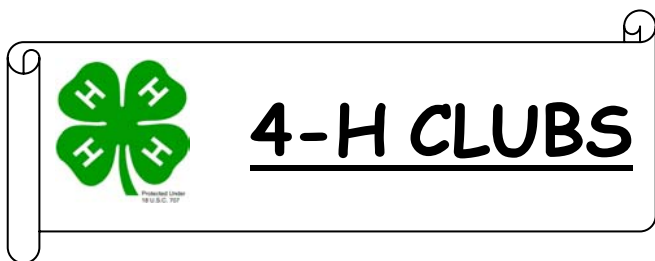

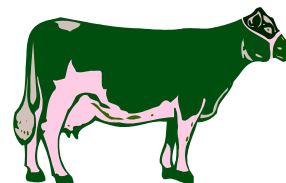
