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Animal Exhibits

(Cloverbud & Youth)

General Information for all animal exhibits:

ALL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS MUST BE MET ...NO EXCEPTIONS



The Putnam County 4-H Youth Development Educator, Animal Fair Chairs and/or the Putnam County 4-H Fair veterinarian have the authority to request the removal of any animal from the fair, at any time, if in their opinion it is for the health and safety of the animal, other animals and/or fairgoers.

1. Pre-registration together with required health certificates must be submitted to the Cornell Cooperative Extension office by July 8, 2009.

Use **ANIMAL REGISTRATION FORM** for all animals

No registrations will be accepted over the telephone.

2. NO WALK-INS AT FAIR WILL BE ALLOWED.

3. A PUTNAM COUNTY ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION CERTIFICATE with an attached photograph of the animal MUST BE COMPLETED FOR EACH ANIMAL and returned with the registration. Computer printed photos are acceptable. For your convenience you may e-mail photos to dla25@Cornell.edu - label subject as "Fair Animal Photo".

4. Due to a limited amount of pens and/or cages, animal entries may be restricted to those animals shown by Putnam County 4-H enrolled youth and/or Putnam County Youth.

5. All animals must be in clean condition and exhibitors must have cared for animals by May 1st of current year.

Onsite Veterinary Check-in: All poultry, rabbits, and livestock for show or exhibition (with the exception of small animal show and dog show entries) must be checked by the fair veterinarian prior to check-in as follows:

Thursday Morning, July 23: 9:30 am – Rabbit Health Check
9:30 am – Poultry Pullorum–Typhoid Testing Vet Check

Friday Morning, July 24: 9:00 am – Livestock Health Check

Contagious Diseases: All animals must be free from contagious disease. Examples of contagious diseases for which animals have been denied include: ringworm, warts, maggots, sore mouth, respiratory infection, ear mites and contagious hoof infections. Animals demonstrating clinical signs or other evidence of infectious, contagious or communicable diseases shall not be allowed on the fairgrounds during the Putnam County 4-H Fair.

Animal Health Reactions: Suspicion of communicable disease is adequate grounds for rejection. **Confirmed diagnosis is not required** since timely removal of suspicious animals is necessary to protect the remaining animals. **All decisions are final.** Owners and/or exhibitors of said animal are responsible for removal of the animal from the fairgrounds immediately. The Putnam County 4-H Fair officials retain the authority to order the removal of all animals originating from the same premises when a potentially serious communicable disease is suspected in any animals in the group. Vesicular diseases are of particular concern. Animals listed on the same CVI or originating from the same address are assumed to be from the same premises.

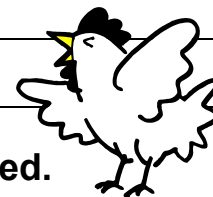
Isolation: In addition to the possibility that the stress of moving can result in a healthy animal becoming ill, assembling groups of animals increases the chance of exposure to contagious disease. It is strongly recommended that all animals returning from a fair or show be isolated from the herd or flock (no direct or indirect contact) for at least two weeks after returning the premise of origin.

Don't wait until the last moment to prepare your animal(s) for the Putnam County 4-H Fair!

ETHICS

*The goal of 4-H is to develop productive, responsible youth who will become respected leaders for tomorrow. We expect all Putnam County 4-H Fair exhibitors and parents to ascribe to and maintain the highest standards of ethical practices. This encompasses honesty and integrity in showmanship, herdsmanship, and respect for other exhibitors. **Any practices deemed unsafe, inhumane or unethical shall be cause for immediate disqualification. The decision of the CCE Educator and/or Animal Fair Chairs is final.***

Poultry



After July 8, absolutely no entries will be accepted.

Additional Health Requirements

1. **All poultry must be checked by the fair veterinarian and receive Poultry Chairperson's approval on Thursday, July 23rd at 9:30 a.m.** and will be dismissed if they are not healthy at that time.
2. All poultry (except doves, pigeons, and waterfowl, which are exempt) must have certification of a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test conducted within 90 days of the Fair **OR** have certification that the birds originate directly from a U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid clean flock which has had an official test in the previous two (2) years. **For all poultry without certification, Pullorum-Typhoid tests will be available at the Fair at 9:30 a.m. on Thursday, July 23rd. There is no charge for this test.** Exhibitors, or a designated person, must be present with the bird during the Pullorum-Typhoid testing. Unattended birds will not be tested and must be removed from the Fairgrounds.
3. It is recommended that you consult with a veterinarian or avian specialist about vaccinating poultry against infectious laryngotracheitis (ILT).

Rules & Regulations

1. **Putnam County Animal ID Certificate MUST ACCOMPANY the pre-registration with an attached photo for each animal.** Computer printed photos are acceptable. For your convenience you may e-mail photos to dla25@Cornell.edu - label subject as "Fair Animal Photo".
2. **Pre-registration is required by July 8, 2009**
3. Poultry Showmanship information sheets will be available at the health check-in.
4. Exhibitors are required to be present during the Breed and Showmanship Contest at 1:00 P.M., Friday, July 24th.
5. **Birds must remain at the Fair until Sunday, July 26th - 5:00 p.m.**
6. CHICKENS: State if bird is to be judged as a show bird or a production bird. Make sure to state breed in the description.
7. **During check-in, any youth (9 and up) who shows Poultry is required to sign up for two (2) hours work in the Poultry Barn.**
8. All exhibitors are responsible for feeding (no wet food permitted) and watering their birds, as well as caring for other birds on exhibit. Water is available at the Fairgrounds; **FEED IS NOT AVAILABLE.**
9. All exhibitors must bring their birds in a durable, sturdy carrier that is the appropriate size for their birds. Exhibitor must stay with birds until Poultry Fair Chair has completely checked them in. Cages will be provided during the Fair.
10. All exhibitors are responsible for keeping the poultry area clean.
11. All poultry must be kept in the barn at night. Any poultry removed from the Poultry Barn will not be allowed to return to the barn. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

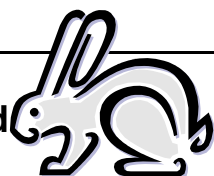

Additional Health Requirements

1. **All rabbits for show must be health checked by the fair veterinarian on Thursday, July 23rd at 9:30 a.m.** and will be dismissed if they are not healthy at that time.
2. All rabbits entered in the Fair must have their nails trimmed.
3. **NO** pregnant does, does with litters, or rabbits under eight (8) weeks of age can be exhibited.

Rules & Regulations

1. **Putnam County Animal ID Certificate with photo MUST BE ATTACHED to the pre-registration for each animal.** Computer printed photos are acceptable. For your convenience you may e-mail photos to dla25@Cornell.edu - label subject as "Fair Animal Photo".
2. **Pre-registration is required by July 8, 2009. Use ANIMAL REGISTRATION FORM.**
3. There is a limit of five (5) entries per Youth exhibitor and two (2) entries per Cloverbud exhibitor. Exhibitor will sign-up for a Showmanship time-slot for Friday upon check-in. Showmanship Study guides will be available at check-in.
4. **Rabbits must remain at the Fair until Sunday, July 26th - 5:00 p.m.**
5. Rabbits of any breed may be entered. All animals will receive ribbons. Rabbits are judged based on the 4-H Danish system.
6. Exhibitor **must** provide dishes/bottles for food and water. **Purina Rabbit Chow will be available.** Exhibitor may provide own food if this is not acceptable.
7. All exhibitors must bring their rabbits in a durable, sturdy carrier that is the appropriate size for their birds. Exhibitor must stay with rabbits until Rabbit Fair Chair has completely checked them in. Cages will be provided during the Fair.
8. **Any rabbit removed from the Rabbit Barn will not be allowed to return to the barn. NO EXCEPTIONS.**

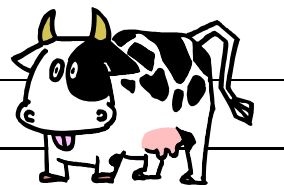

MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS – NO EXCEPTIONS

The Putnam County 4-H Fair follows all regulations set forth by the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets-Division of Animal Industry. For a complete text of these regulations, go to www.agmkt.state.ny.us.

on Friday, July 23, 9:00 a.m.**

Rules & Regulations

1. **Pre-registration is due no later than 4:00 P.M. on July 8, 2009.**
All REQUIRED paperwork and health requirements are due at time of pre-registration.
2. Required overnight care of all Livestock must be arranged prior to Friday check-in. Contact Livestock Fair Chair or 4-H Animal Intern to discuss such arrangements.
3. **Feed and Bedding will not be provided** and must be provided by exhibitor. All exhibitors are required to use sturdy 5-gallon buckets with handles for water.
4. All 4-H clubs and individuals showing livestock are required to help with set-up (immediately after check-in, Friday, July 24) and clean up of livestock area (starting at 5:00 pm, Sunday, July 26).
5. Suggested attire for youth showing livestock: neat, clean and appropriately dressed (4-H Club tee shirts are acceptable). For foot safety reasons, it is recommended that livestock exhibitors wear an all-leather shoe/boot. Open toe shoes/sandals may not be worn. FYI: There are ideal standards of dress for certain species, if you are interested in this information call Cornell Cooperative Extension.
6. **Cloverbuds (5-8 years of age) are not eligible to enter Large Livestock.**

Special Contests

1. **Herdsmanship Awards:** Will be awarded to Youth exhibitors who demonstrated outstanding: (1) Proper care of animal; (2) Appearance of pen; (3) Overall order and cleanliness; (4) Appearance and conduct of the individual during all three days of the Fair; (5) Willingness to assume responsibility. All livestock exhibitors must do their own work or they can be disqualified from Herdsmanship Award; and (6) Cooperation with the Livestock Fair Chair, other exhibitors, and the public during the Fair
2. **Livestock Costume Class** will be held after the livestock show. Exhibitors can be part of the costume. The Theme must be printed on 3" x 5" index card and handed to the show secretary upon entering the ring.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Cleaning and Disinfection: All building areas on the Fairgrounds housing animals must be cleaned and disinfected upon departure from the Fair. Anyone exhibiting animals is responsible for the area in which their animal was housed, unless prior arrangements have been made with another party. (The Extension Educator must be made aware of such arrangements ahead of time).

Kidding and Lambing: Due to a concern about the spread of Scrapie, any sheep or goats that are exhibited at the Putnam County 4-H Fair that have recently given birth or have a vaginal discharge, will be ordered removed along with their offspring. (*The causative agent for scrapie may be present in high concentration in fluids associated with the birth and the risk of transmission is considered highest at that time.*)

Out of State Origin Livestock: All animals presented that originate from a location other than New York shall meet the NYS importation regulations appropriate to the species in addition to the Putnam County 4-H Fair animal health requirements. EXPLANATION OF LIVESTOCK ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

CERTIFICATE OF VETERINARY INSPECTION (CVI):

For all New York Origin Livestock – Cattle, sheep, goats, swine, llamas, deer, monkeys, misc. ruminants, camels and elephants – a valid intrastate CVI (AI 61) is required to enter the fairgrounds. Each animal must be individually identified on the CVI. The CVI must be issued on or after May 1 of the current year by an accredited veterinarian. All animals must be uniquely identified. The type and direction of certificate required depends on the origins on the livestock.

SHEEP AND GOATS: animals must be individually identified with USDA approved individual scrapie program identification. Identification must be one of the following: 1) USDA approved tags or 2) a USDA approved premises tattoo. For information on scrapie ID, contact USDA at 518-869-9007.

ALL OTHERS: animals must be uniquely identified in one of the following ways: ear tag, ear notches, tattoos or electronic identification or a sketch or photograph signed and dated by an accredited veterinarian who has inspected the individual animal.

The Putnam County 4-H Fair officials and/or fair veterinarian are responsible for reviewing all CVI for compliance with state regulations and for verifying individual identification of exhibited animals presented on a valid The Putnam County 4-H Fair officials and veterinarian are responsible for rejecting any animal that does not meet the documentation requirements or is not properly identified. Officials must sign or stamp all satisfactory CVI's, indicate the date inspected and check off animals that are present at the fair. Putnam County Fair officials and/or Fair veterinarians may deny admission to or require removal from the fair premises, or require the segregation of any animal showing signs of or exposure to an infection, contagious or communicable disease.

CURRENT RABIES VACCINATION:

Current rabies vaccination is required for all species for which there is a USDA licensed vaccine available (cattle, horse, sheep, dog, cat ferret) and that are 105 days or older on the date of arrival at the fair.

Proof of vaccination must include the name of product used, the date of administration, duration of immunity if longer than one year and the signature of the veterinarian. The vaccine must be administered prior to pre-registration (July 8) but no greater than the labeled time specified for active protection against rabies. The animal's rabies vaccination status must remain current throughout its stay at the Fair.

Minimum Age of Vaccination: Animals **105 days of age or older** on the date of arrival at the Fair must be vaccinated for rabies (for those species requiring vaccination).

Booster Vaccination: Animals previously vaccinated for rabies but whose vaccine status have expired, are eligible for exhibition upon receiving a booster vaccination. Proof of previous vaccination is required.

NOTE: Rabies titers in lieu of current rabies vaccination is not acceptable.

Rabies Vaccination for off-label mammalian species: In consideration of public health concerns, it is strongly recommended that all mammals to be exhibited at any fair in NYS be vaccinated against rabies. The NYS Interdepartmental Rabies Committee recognized the probable efficacy and safety of killed rabies vaccine for off-label mammalian species; however, **in cases of rabies exposure**, the NYS Department of Health cannot recognize, as protected, rabies vaccinated animals for which there is not licensed rabies vaccine. Exhibitors should consult their veterinarian for further information.

A signed, written statement from a veterinarian is required as proof of vaccination. A valid animal health certificate which has the vaccination(s) listed and is signed by the issuing veterinarian is acceptable proof of vaccination. No person shall present an interstate or intrastate certificate of veterinary inspection that has been altered by any one other than the issuing veterinarian or authorized agent.

BOVINE RESPIRATORY DISEASE COMPLEX VACCINATION

All cattle must be currently vaccinated against bovine respiratory disease complex including bovine respiratory syncytial virus (BRSV), bovine virus diarrhea (BVD), infectious bovine rhinotracheitis (IBR) and parainfluenza (PI), with a product administered in a manner and time frame adequate to confer protective immunity for these diseases for the duration of the Fair. A valid animal health certificate which has the vaccination listed and is signed by the issuing veterinarian is acceptable proof of vaccination.

NEGATIVE EQUINE INFECTIOUS ANEMIA (EIA)

Required for all equine 6 months of age or older. The equine must be accompanied by a valid negative EIA test record. This record must also be mailed with the pre-registration form. The test must have been conducted during the current or previous calendar years for New York origin equine. For imported equine, the test must be conducted within 12 months of entry. The EIA test certificate must include a complete description of the horse.

BVD-PI TESTING:

- All cattle, llamas, alpacas, guanacos and vicunas (new world camelids) must be negative to an approved test appropriate to detect Bovine Viral Diarrhea persistent infection (BVD-PI) This is a once in a lifetime test that must be reported on the required certificate of veterinary inspection. The issuing veterinarian is responsible for verifying the validity of the test, the identification of the animal and recording the test date on the CVI. If a previous test is not verifiable the test must be repeated.

Cattle Testing:

- Currently acceptable BVD tests for cattle less than 61 days old:
 - Skin notch Antigen Capture ELISA (ACE) or Immunohistochemistry (IHC)
 - whole blood virus isolation
 - whole blood PCR

- Currently acceptable BVD tests for cattle 61 days of age and older:
 - Skin notch Antigen Capture ELISA (ACE) or Immunohistochemistry (IHC)
 - Serum or milk Antigen Capture ELISA (ACE)
 - whole blood virus isolation
 - whole blood PCR

NOTE: The Animal Health Diagnostic Center at Cornell University can conduct testing on pools of up to 10 cattle.

Llama, Alpaca, Guanaco, Vicuna Testing

- Currently acceptable BVD tests:
 - PCR
 - Whole blood virus isolation

NOTE: The Animal Health Diagnostic Center at Cornell University can pool llama, etc. samples for PCR testing as follows: Animals less than 61 days of age can be tested in pools of 2 animals, whole blood only. Animals 61 days of age and older can be tested in pools of 5 animals using whole blood, serum or plasma.

VETERINARY STATEMENT:

For all SHEEP and GOATS only:

- The CVI must contain a written statement from the issuing accredited veterinarian that the flock or origin was inspected after May 1 of the current year and no evidence of contagious, infectious or communicable diseases was found.
- If evidence of soremouth (contagious ecthyma) is found on any sheep, the entire exhibit including the affected animals shall immediately be removed from the Fair premises with the holding pens cleaned and disinfected immediately after removal.

1. All Ferrets over 105 days of age must have proof of Rabies vaccination. Certificate must be attached to pre-registration form.

2. Pre-registration form, Animal ID certificate and rabies certificate (if required) are due **no later than 4:00 p.m., July 8, 2009. Use ANIMAL REGISTRATION FORM**
3. All small pets must be in their own cages or tanks.
4. Small pets **CANNOT STAY OVERNIGHT.**

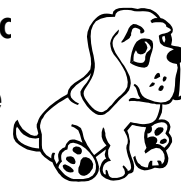

2. **Pre-registration is required by July 8, 2008. Use ANIMAL REGISTRATION FORM**
All dogs must be on leashes. A bitch in season is not allowed in the park. **Only pre-registered dogs are permitted at the Fair.** The ORANGE registration tag will be mailed to you upon receipt of your pre-registration form, Animal ID and required health certificate. **NO** dog will be allowed on fair grounds without this tag. Registered dogs are not permitted in any Exhibit Building, Tent or near Livestock.
3. All owners should bring water and pick-up bags for their dogs. Dogs should be walked in designated dog walk areas ONLY.
4. If you are **not** a 4-H Dog Club Member, your dog will be subject to a temperament screening by Dog Fair Chair
