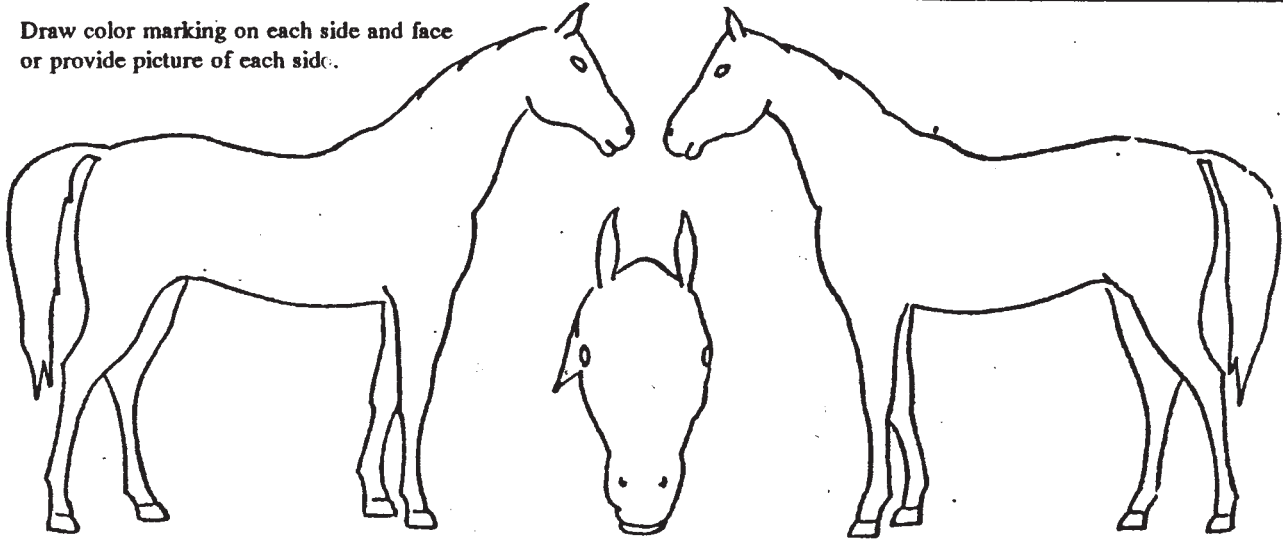

COUNTY HORSE CERTIFICATION RULES

1. If several children in a family have the horse certified in their names, they can all use the horse, but in different performance classes. For example, John rides the horse in Western Pleasure; Sue rides it in Western Equitation (NO to John riding Junior Western Pleasure and Sue riding Senior Western Pleasure).
2. If a 4-H'er owns a horse and certifies it, another youth from the community could lease that horse (if they don't own one). Both 4-H'ers could ride the horse, but it has to be in different show divisions. For example, Joe rides the horse in Gymkhana; Sam rides it in Western Division.
3. First and second year riders, aged 12 and under, can ride in Walk-Trot, Walk-Jog class. They can use any certified horse (certified by themselves or any other 4-H'er) in any walk-trot, walk-jog class.
4. One certificate is required for each horse, but several 4-H'ers names can be put on the certificate.

Be sure a current EIA (Coggins) Certificate is available for 4-H camp, all shows and clinics. A current test is one done during the current year or the previous year.

*** A **separate** sheet is required for each horse. Additional sheets may be obtained from the 4-H office (786-2251). However, if several youth in the same family are certifying the same horse, all of the youth can be listed on the horse certificate.

SPECIAL NOTICE: To be eligible to show at the Wyoming County Fair, a foal born this year must either be from a mare registered to the member before June 1 this year OR the foal itself must be registered with the office before June 1 this year. No foals acquired after June 1 this year may be exhibited.

You can only certify one leased horse if you don't own a horse. Also, this leased horse must be used in all classes in which you participate.

You may also lease a donkey, mule and miniature horse, if you don't own one in addition to a horse or pony.

If you ride Junior Level at the Qualifying show, you must ride Junior Level at the fair (not Walk-Trot)!
