The on farm session will be held **Tuesday, June 7th** from 7:30am – 12:30pm at Coyne Farms in Avon, NY.

Animal Well-Being and Cow Comfort will cover handling large animals, cow behavior, facility design, stocking density, bedding options, hygiene scoring, and the economics of cow comfort.

Dr. Art Sherman, a state veterinarian, will take participants on farm and outline the NYSCHAP Animal Welfare certification process.

The on farm session will be held **Saturday, June 18th** from 10:00am–2:00pm.

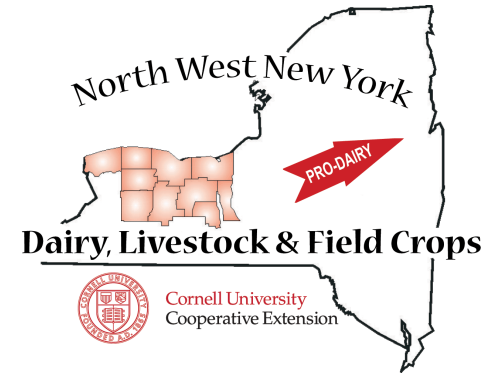
Herd Health and Herdsmanship will cover identifying sick cows, metabolic diseases, infectious diseases, treatment decision making, and understanding the role of vaccines and antibiotics. One session will feature a herdsman panel discussion.

On farm Dr. Jerry Bertoldo will teach participants how to perform a physical examination on a cow, as well as intravenous administration and drenching methods. The host dairy herdsman will go through the farm's health monitoring procedures, treatment rationale and record keeping.
